CIRCULAR

PROCEDURE FOR CALCULATION OF GRADES FOR CURRENT INTERMEDIATE SEMESTERS

Students of UG (BE II, IV and VI semesters) and PG (MBA, M.Tech II semester and MCA II and IV semesters) are hereby informed to note the following guidelines adopted for computation of even semester (Jan. – Jul. 2020) grades.

General

1. As per UGC guidelines referred above, grades intermediate semesters shall be calculated by giving 50% weightage to CIE of current even semester and 50% weightage to SEE of preceding semester only. If the maximum marks for CIE and SEE are not 50, marks scored by the student shall be proportionately scaled, up or down
2. If marks scored by a student require scaling at any stage of calculation, either up or down, and the marks after scaling are not a whole number, the scaled marks shall be rounded up to the next larger integer at that stage of calculation

PROCEDURE FOR CALCULATION OF GRADES

1. Identification of credit courses of current intermediate semester
2. Calculation of marks and grades for courses with SEE based on viva-voce only (internship, mini-projects, projects, etc.) – CIE and SEE assessment as per applicable scheme and regulations
3. Calculation of marks for courses with SEE based theory, practical or other forms of assessment - calculation of average of SEE marks for the credited courses of the preceding semester (excluding CIE) for eligible students
4. Calculation of grades of credited courses in the current intermediate semester =
CIE of current intermediate semester (50 Marks) + SEE average of credited of preceding semester
Average SEE <10 Marks to be treated as Fail
5. Grades to be awarded as per scheme and regulation
6. For non-credit and /or mandatory courses , CIE = SEE to be considered
7. Improvisation of grade is permitted for such students who are not satisfied with the grade awarded. Such students can register for those courses and appear in the immediate next examination with only ONE subsequent attempt. In such cases, the student will be awarded, better of the two grades.




